WHO WE ARE: A crown agency of the Government of Alberta, the Alberta Foundation for the Arts (AFA) was established in 1991 with a mandate to support and contribute to the development of the arts in Alberta. It replaced the Alberta Art Foundation, the Alberta Foundation for the Performing Arts, the Alberta Foundation for the Literary Arts, and the arts and cultural industries grant programs of Alberta Culture and Multiculturalism. Reporting to Alberta's Minister of Culture, and guided by the objectives found in the 1991 Alberta Foundation for the Arts Act (AFA Act), available from the Queen's Printer, the AFA provides grant funding to artists and art organizations to encourage the growth and development of the arts sector. It also promotes the arts and manages an extensive art collection, valued at over \$10 million, featuring work from artists all over the province.

WHAT WE DO:

GRANTS: The AFA's strategies are implemented by two dedicated teams. The AFA Board is responsible for the disbursement of grants, prizes, and competitions, as well as the acquisition, exhibition, and preservation of art. Administrative, consultative, and technical support is provided by the Ministry of Culture's Arts Branch. The AFA receives funds annually from the Alberta Lottery Fund, which it then distributes, in partnership with the Arts Branch of the Alberta Government's Alberta Culture department, to artists and art organizations across Alberta. AFA grant funding supports creative activity in the performing, visual, literary, and the film/video arts disciplines. AFA grants serve every region in the province, enhance the province's economic and social status, and contribute to every Albertans' quality of life. Grants from the AFA support a wide range of art initiatives including: Festivals/Artists-in-Residence programs Emerging artists Exhibits Community events Performances Education

ARTS PROMOTION: The AFA supports the arts through various promotional strategies and activities which help to generate awareness of the value of the arts with the public and key stakeholders.

AFA ART COLLECTION: Since 1972, the AFA and its predecessor foundation, the Alberta Art Foundation, has been collecting and managing a wide range of artwork that continues to grow and expand exponentially. Pieces from this collection are exhibited and showcased locally, provincially, and nationally, and are enjoyed by thousands of Albertans. Supported by the Alberta Historical Resources Foundation, the program encourages best practices in revitalization through heritage conservation. AMSP uses the "Four-Point Approach" - Design, Marketing, Organization, and Economic Development - to celebrate the unique historic and architectural character of Main Street. Working closely with the Municipal Heritage Partnership Program, Alberta Main Street communities have access to ongoing support for heritage planning and Municipal Historic Resources are eligible for matching conservation funding for approved conservation work.

The primary purpose of the Foundation is to encourage initiatives that preserve and interpret Alberta's rich heritage. This is done by providing financial, technical and professional assistance to community-based heritage projects ranging from the restoration of historic buildings to the publishing of community histories.

The program includes the following funding categories: Heritage Awareness, Historical Resource Conservation, Publications, Research, Roger Soderstrom Scholarship and Transportation/Industrial Artifact Preservation. The deadlines are February 1 and September 1.

Bob Etherington Heritage Trades Scholarship: This scholarship was established through a generous donation from the daughters of the late Bob Etherington, who was a journeyman carpenter and a building inspector with the City of Calgary. This scholarship aims to help develop the heritage trades in Alberta by providing financial support to eligible tradespersons attending training in heritage conservation work. The application deadlines for the Roger Soderstrom Scholarship and Bob Etherington Heritage Trades Scholarship are February 1st and October 1st.

Fund and support effective grassroots environmental projects; build capacity and sustainability in the voluntary sector; and promote the environment as the foundation of a healthy community. There are 4 different grants offered and they are:

- 1. Community Grants is designed to support community based projects that typically focus on local opportunities for change through stewardship and action.
- 2. Major Project Grants is designed to support more comprehensive projects that have the potential to result in substantial environmental benefit.
- 3. Multi-Year Implementation Grants will support more comprehensive projects perhaps with distinct phases that are conducted over a longer period of time.
- 4. Youth Environmental Stewardship was created to enable Alberta Youth to turn their ideas for stewardship into action and provide up to \$5,000 to a single project undertaken by an individual or group of youth (ages 15-16).

Professional Development Grants: Provides financial support for professional development opportunities undertaken by individual members and employees and volunteers from Institutional Member museums. Deadline: February 1, September 1
