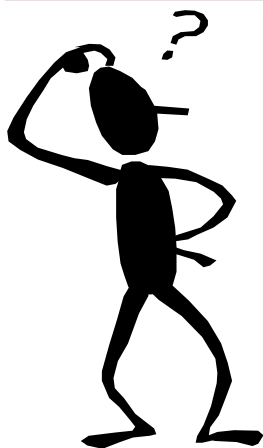

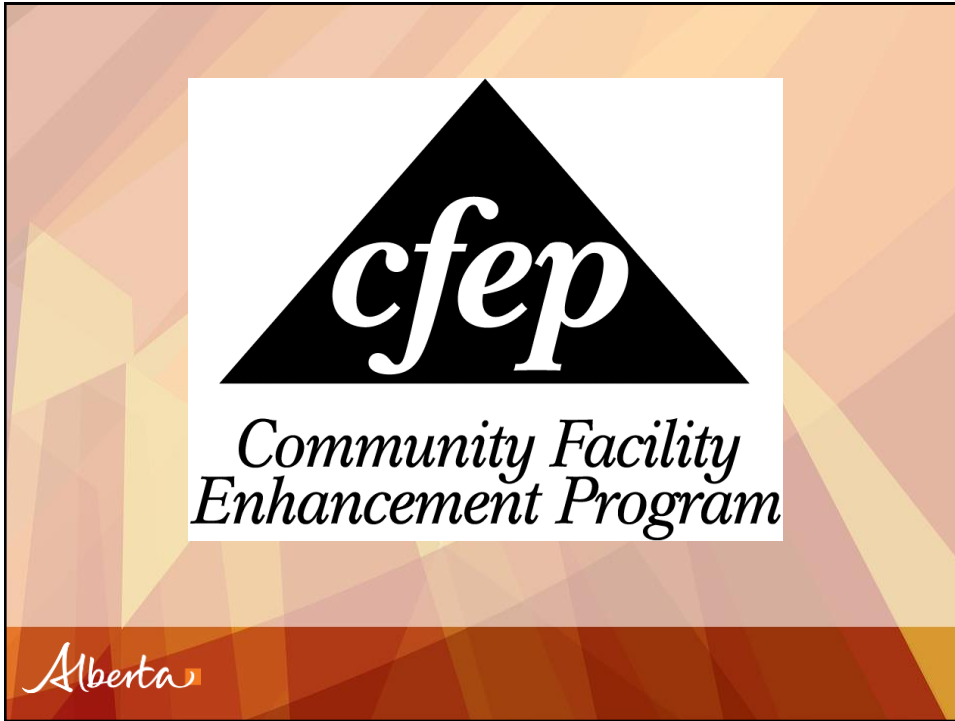

Community Facility Enhancement Program

- Bricks and mortar in nature
- Playgrounds
- Disaster funding
- Maximum grant request \$125,000
- Limited to one capital grant per fiscal year
- Matching grant program

Community Facility Enhancement Program

Deadline Dates and Application Review Timelines

- ❖ **Deadline: March 15** – applications are reviewed between April 1 and June 30
- ❖ **Deadline: June 15** – applications are reviewed between July 1 and September 30
- ❖ **Deadline: September 15** – applications are reviewed between October 1 and December 31
- ❖ **Deadline: December 15** – applications are reviewed between January 2 and March 31





Community Initiatives Program Project Based

- **Intended for projects that are new or finite**
- **Maximum \$75,000 grant request**
- **Can provide up to \$10,000 in non-matching funds**
- **Funding thresholds in place: Travel \$10,000; Technology \$50,000**

- Part 21 of the *Business Corporations Act* – Extra-Provincial Corporations
- *Societies Act*

- *Universities, colleges and institutes as defined under the Post-secondary Learning Act*



Community Initiatives Program Operating

- Organizations must be registered for a minimum of 1 year
- Up to a maximum 2 years of operating expenses
- Matching grant program
- Eligible for 1 operating grant every 3 years
- Maximum \$75,000 grant request



Community Initiatives Program International Development

- Support is provided for projects in developing countries
- Applying organizations must be Alberta based, non-government, and small to medium based in size
- Maximum \$25,000 grant request
- Cash match only and based on donations made by Albertans to humanitarian projects

What you need to know

- **Submit all required documentation and use the correct application form.**
- **Only one capital and one non-capital grant per fiscal year through either CFEP or CIP.**
- **Organizations with overdue accounting will not be considered for funding.**
- **Funding is not guaranteed/reduced funding may be awarded.**
- **Applicants must submit a financial accounting for funds received.**
